AWARENESS GRANT 2021

Dear Councillor,

Details of the Anti-Litter & Anti-Graffiti Awareness Grant Scheme (ALAGS) were issued on the 23rd July 2021 (Circular Letter LU 04 21) by the Department of Environment, Climate and Communications (DECC). DECC provided a grant of €20,000 towards Kilkenny County Council. Kilkenny County Council provided a further €10,000 in the budget as required under the funding scheme.

A wide range of activities (linked to the Litter Management Plan) were undertaken by the Council from this funding in 2021 including: the pilot musical bins project, the extensive National Spring Clean, Picker Pals Programme and the "Bag It, Bin It" antidog fouling campaign. A balance of €11,075 is available to distribute to local communities for locally based projects. In this regard, the Anti-Litter and Anti-Graffiti Awareness Grant was advertised last March and 20 community applications were received.

The DECC provided guidelines on eligible projects (Circular Appendix 1) and they include: projects highlighting awareness of issues regarding dog fouling, plays, puppet shows, interactive workshops, art projects mainly aimed at schools, provision of anti-litter awareness materials, local advertising and projects/activities should seek to promote greater public awareness and education in relation to litter and/or graffiti.

The DECC circular reminded all Councils that grant aid for expenditure on large capital items are <u>not</u> eligible (e.g. Signage, Litter Bins.)

All applications were evaluated and the following grant allocations have been recommended by the evaluation committee (Bernadette Moloney & Deirdre Trait of the Environment Section). One of the main criteria is linkage/alignment with the Council's recently adopted Litter Management Plan. All applications met the grant criteria and are recommended for approval as listed below.
